Hike #993 description from July 6 & 7, 1940: "Leave Square as soon as possible after 2:00 on Saturday. Take trail at Blue Mountain Lake with packs designed for carrying and hike the 3 miles into Tirrell pond, north of Blue Mountain. Sunday come out by a different trail..." Then on July 24, 1940, Paul Williams led a hike called HOUNDS-MUSIC: "Bonfire and sing at dusk near summer camp ... Hot hounds for all will be served beside the bonfire."

Bring your lunch and a dish to pass and we will eat under one of the many shade trees. After lunch we will walk the many marked trails.
