The Old Forge Winter Sports Association (OFWSA) was formed in 1935. They decided it would be a great idea to have a “snow train” to bring people to ski for a weekend. It ran for eight weekends during the winter. “The first snow train left Utica for Old Forge on January 19, 1936, carrying 19 Tramps and Trailers. The snow trains were popular with the T. & T., for they offered cheap and comfortable transportation to a fine skiing area, with ski tows and — very important! — with restaurants. Until the war put a stop to the snow trains, the Club took advantage of them regularly.”
